<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Pilgrims need to have breakfast before beginning the walk and must bring their own lunch and afternoon tea for this day of walking.</li><li>- This is a moderate day walk that takes in a number of interesting historical features as it ascends from the plains into the mountains. There is one steep and long set of steps to ascend from the Knapsack Viaduct to Elizabeth / Marge's Lookout.</li><li>- There will be a time of prayer and reflection at Elizabeth / Marge's Lookout</li><li>- Significant sights on the walk include:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>o Knapsack Viaduct</li><li>o Elizabeth Lookout / Marge's Lookout</li><li>o Views over the Nepean River and Sydney Basin</li><li>o Glenbrook Lagoon</li></ul></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- There are no water refill points or toilets between Our Lady of the Way Church and St Finbar's Church. Pilgrims need to carry a minimum of 2.5 L of water between these points.</li><li>- The pilgrimage leaders carry a 'toilet pack' (shovel, toilet paper and hand sanitizer) that can be used at any time – just find a tucked away spot, dig a hole about 15 cm deep, do your business, throw in any toilet paper used and put a rock on top to hold it down, then backfill so there's no evidence you've been there!</li><li>- One cold shower is available at Glenbrook Parish.</li><li>- Emu Plains Station is approximately 2.2 km from Our Lady of the Way Church; Glenbrook Station is approximately 1.4 km from St Finbar's Church.</li></ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This is a comfortable day walk, suitable for those of moderate fitness levels. There are a number of significant ascents and descents between Mount Riverview and Winmalee including the infamous concrete hill ascent to Rickard Road, a short but technical descent to reach the stunning Blue Gum Forest of Sun Valley and Long Angle Valley and a long ascent out of Long Angle Valley. The valley floor itself is beautiful and flat. Some road walking at the end of the day is required to reach St Thomas Aquinas church.</li> <li>- You are invited to take some time in the afternoon to explore the beautiful bushy property of Saint Thomas Aquinas / Saint Columba's College (former Sydney Archdiocesan seminary: 1909 - 1977) or take time for personal prayer in the church.</li> <li>- Significant sights on the walk include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Glenbrook Lagoon</li> <li>o Cripple Creek Reserve</li> <li>o Long Angle Valley</li> <li>o Saint Columba's College</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- There are no water refill points or toilets between St Finbar's Church and St Thomas Aquinas School. Pilgrims need to carry a minimum of 3 L of water. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This is a long day of walking and a high level of endurance is required. The walk begins by following a local undulating bush track through Birdwood Gully to reach Faulconbridge. The route then heads out along Faulconbridge Ridge (road walking) before descending steeply to Linden Creek and then ascending steeply to reach the end of Linden Ridge. From here the route follows the gently undulating ridge in a generally south-westerly direction to reach Linden.</li> <li>- The stretch along Linden Ridge is an ideal opportunity to enjoy some personal prayer time and reflection.</li> <li>- Significant sights on the walk include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Birdwood Gully</li> <li>o Linden Ridge with views of Mount Banks and Mount Hay</li> <li>o Linden Observatory (c. 1938 – 1948)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- There is a water refill point near Hunter Way, Faulconbridge. Pilgrims need to carry a minimum of 2 L of water to this point, and a minimum of 3 L between Hunter Way and Linden Observatory. The pilgrimage leaders carry a 'toilet pack' that can be used at any time.</li> <li>- Springwood and Faulconbridge Train Stations can be accessed for those finding the walk difficult or wishing to walk only the first section of the track on this day. Linden Observatory is approximately 2.0 km from Linden Train Station.</li> <li>- 1 warm shower is available at Linden Observatory.</li> </ul>

*Track + other notes:*

- This day begins with a local walk past the pretty 'Fairy Falls' before a short section of road walking connects the track with the historic Bruce's walk which began as a maintenance track for the power supply in 1931 and was cleared again in 1986 by two local walkers – Jim Smith and Wilf Hilder. This section of the walk has two steep descents and ascents (into and out of valleys) that are quite difficult and require a moderate level of fitness. Walkers are encouraged to wear long sleeves and pants for this stretch of the walk as some of the vegetation can be quite scratchy.
- Significant sights on the walk include:
  - o Fairy Falls
  - o Creek crossings
  - o Artifacts associated with Bruce's walk including:
    - Signs
    - Ladders
    - Seats
    - Shelter Caves
  - o Wentworth Falls Lake (you're welcome to take a dip!)
  - o Views of the Jamison Valley
- There is a small supermarket in Wentworth Falls for restocking.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- There is no walking on this day. Pilgrims should bring an Opal / credit card to travel by train between Blackheath and Bell.</li> <li>- The Chapel of the Magi is a humble, open-air chapel on a bush property in Bell. The property was purchased in 2015 to coincide with the first Epiphany Pilgrimage, and was intended as the final destination for the journey, where the placement of each pilgrim's stone would gradually lead to the construction of a chapel (see the journal for more information). At some point in the future, it is hoped that a small cabin will be built at the property for pilgrims to enjoy upon finishing their journey.</li> <li>- In 2019 – 2020, bushfires swept across the Darling Causeway and through the township of Bell destroying homes and impacting properties including those adjacent to the chapel. Praise be to God and through the efforts of NSW RFS, the chapel was not affected by the fire.
